The 2009 Program Committee invites you, your colleagues, associates and trainees to submit abstracts of your research for presentation at our 38th Annual Meeting. A copy of the abstract form will appear in the January, February and March 2009 issues of *The Journal of Clinical Pharmacology*, and is also available on our website, www.ACCP1.org. Additional copies of the form may also be obtained from the College's Executive Office.

This year the College is pleased to offer eight (8) Student/Trainee Awards for the best abstract submissions. Each award will consist of a \$1,000 honorarium and a certificate. Award winners will also receive a complimentary registration to attend the annual meeting and an invitation to attend the Honors and Awards dinner. Please encourage all students/trainees to submit abstracts of their research to compete for these awards. Please indicate on the front of the form that the abstract is a student/trainee submission.

Also, this year there will be a special Poster/Podium Session during Symposium I, entitled *Innovations in Research & Development: Driving Change and Leading the Way*. Abstracts which describe cutting-edge, innovative approaches to drug development are eligible for this session, which will be held in the afternoon on September 13, 2009. Authors will briefly present their work at the podium (2-3 minutes, using 2-3 slides), followed by a general poster viewing. Up to eight (8) abstracts will be selected for this special session by the Program Committee.

“Encore” abstracts, i.e., those abstracts which have already been presented at other professional meetings but which may also provide interesting discussion at our meeting, will also be accepted. These abstracts must be clearly marked “ENCORE” on the front of the abstract form. If previously published, the citation for the abstract must also be provided.

Those abstracts selected for presentation will be published in the September 2009 issue of *The Journal of Clinical Pharmacology*, the official publication of the American College of Clinical Pharmacology, and copies of the journal will be distributed at the Annual Meeting. GUIDELINES FOR SUBMISSION OF ABSTRACTS

2009 ANNUAL MEETING

Submission of abstracts in the following areas is encouraged:

- Clinical Pharmacokinetics and Pharmacodynamics
- Clinical Trials and Human Pharmacology
- Experimental Pharmacology for *in vitro* and *in vivo* studies
- Applications of Modeling and Simulation
- Pharmacoepidemiology / Pharmacogenomics / Stratified Medicine
- Pharmacoconomics / Disease Management
- Translational Medicine / Biomarkers / Imaging
- Decision-making in Research, Development and Approval
- Innovations in Research and Development

Primary criteria for acceptance of abstracts are:

- Applicability to the discipline of clinical pharmacology and translational medicine
- Innovation and scientific merit
- Relevance to the mission of the College

Each abstract must also contain:

- A statement of purpose, innovation or hypothesis
- Description of methods and materials
- Data and results
- Interpretation, conclusion or significance
